### Hello GREEN TEAM Teachers!

Last month, we sent out GREEN TEAM kits to over 200 schools that had registered so far this school year. If you registered recenty, you'll receive a kit soon.

THE GREEN TEAM provides an assortment of resources to help you plan lessons and activities that engage your students with understanding environmental issues. These educational materials are available in <u>GREEN TEAM kits</u> mailed to all participants.

## Some highlights include:

- The <u>Slash Trash Lesson</u> encourages students to track waste disposal at home as they identify and implement new waste reduction activities.
- The <u>Climate Change Activities</u> ask students to identify and track opportunities to conserve energy at home and at school.
- The <u>Clean Air Activities</u> empower students to improve air quality around their schools by creating an Idle Free Zone.

#### **GREEN TEAM in the Spotlight**

Last Spring, all schools in the **Greenfield Public School District** started collecting food scraps from their lunchrooms and sending them to Martin's Compost Farm. A <u>recent post</u> on the Center for EcoTechnology blog describes how wasted food is transformed into a nutrient-rich soil amendment at compost operations like Martin's Compost Farm. The creation of this district-wide program to divert wasted food from disposal was made possible by a grant from the MassDEP <u>Sustainable Materials</u> Recovery Program.
