Other Resources

The National Park Service is offering <u>free park passes for 4th graders!</u> These passes offer free access to national parks, forests, and wild refuges for the entire 2015-2016 school year.

NPR recently reported that <u>short school lunch periods cause kids to eat less and throw away more</u>. The study, by the Harvard School of Public Health, looked at 1,000 Massachusetts students in grades 3 to 8. They found that kids with less than 20 minutes to eat miss out on valuable nutrition and contribute to increased food waste.

The First Lego League 2015 TRASH TREK Challenge is underway! This challenge includes both a Project (design an innovative solution to a trash problem), and a Robot Game (build Lego robots that sort and transport trash).
