Hello GREEN TEAM Teachers!

Summer is at its peak, and here at THE GREEN TEAM we are busy preparing for another exciting school year! <u>GREEN TEAM registration for the 2019-2020 school year</u> is now open, and <u>GREEN TEAM Classroom Kits</u> will be mailed in September! Remember, GREEN TEAM registrations do not carry over into the new school year, so please register now to enroll for 2019-2020.

We have recycling equipment in stock at three locations throughout the state. To request <u>free recycling</u> and <u>composting equipment</u>, please <u>register for the 2019-2020 school year</u> and submit a<u>recycling</u> <u>equipment application form</u>. The Boston-area location will have three scheduled distribution dates during the 2019-2020 school year. The first will be **Wednesday**, **September 25**, **so be sure to submit your equipment request by September 20th**. There will be two other distribution dates, one in November and one in April.

Equipment distributions from the Amherst and Pittsfield locations are scheduled by appointment. You will be provided with additional information upon approval of your equipment request.

School Programs, Events, Competitions, and Professional Development

Mark your calendars with these grant opportunities, workshops, conferences, and more!

August 5-9 – Mass Audubon's Summer Professional Development course, <u>Earth and Human Activity:</u> <u>Climate Change Science & Community-based Solutions</u>, at Tidmarsh Wildlife Sanctuary in Plymouth. Discover simple lessons involving real datasets collected in Massachusetts and beyond to help your students practice science skills from asking questions to data analysis and communication.

September 1 – Deadline for Massachusetts Agriculture in the Classroom Mini-Grant applications. Massachusetts Agriculture in the Classroom awards mini-grants of up to \$1,500 to Massachusetts educators, after-school programs, farms working with schools, and youth gardening organizations for agriculturally-based educational projects. September 20 – Deadline to submit THE GREEN TEAM <u>recycling equipment application</u> for the September 25th distribution day to be held in West Roxbury. (Equipment requests for the Amherst and Pittsfield equipment locations may be submitted at any time).

September 20 – The <u>Green Careers Conference</u> at the MA Division of Fisheries and Wildlife in Westborough. This event showcases careers in sustainability, with stakeholders from the government, business, education, and non-profit sectors.

September 25 – Distribution day for GREEN TEAM recycling equipment for schools in the Boston area. Register for THE GREEN TEAM for the 2019-2020 school year and submit a recycling equipment application by September 20th to request equipment. There will also be distribution dates in November and April.

October 1 – Deadline for <u>Toshiba America Foundation grants</u> (grades K-5, \$1000). The Toshiba America Foundation awards grants to educators who are passionate about making mathematics and science more engaging for their students. This deadline is for educators of grades K-5, and offers grants up to \$1,000.

November 15 – Keep America Beautiful's <u>America Recycles Day</u>. Take action in your community by getting involved with a local event on this nationally-recognized day dedicated to promoting and celebrating recycling in the United States. <u>Find a local event</u> or register your own!
